

Management of activities and outings

- Review the organization of current activities and routines to avoid groupings being created (we are not all going to drink water at the same time, wash our hands, collect our mattresses, look for a toy, etc.).
- Avoid activities with direct contact between children (ex. holding hands, cuddling) or sharing toys (ex. rather than playing a board game where all children touch pawns or dice), it is only one child among the group which handles the material), as far as possible.
- Maximize outdoor outings by encouraging contactless activities.
- Avoid, as much as possible, games where there is contact between kids.
- Limit, if possible, the use of toys, books, board games to one child at a time.
- Limit the number of toys and games in the play area. Limit the bins with toys.
 - You can create separate boxes or bags with toys for each child.
 - Remove all toys that are difficult to clean (ex. puzzles, plasticine, card game, etc.).
- Avoid the entry and exit of comfort material for children (ex. Soft toys, comforter, etc.) and ensure it's cleaned regularly (avoid incorporating material from outside).
- Authorize the use of the outdoor play module only if it is possible to disinfect it on a regular basis
